Transformation - a new purpose
Have you ever heard of the famous
quote, 'Eat, drink and be merry for
tomorrow we die'. It's a phrase that is
occasionally used today but its origins lie in
the dim and distant past. Paul used it as a
quote in 1 Corinthians 15:22. However the
phrase also appears in the Old Testament
used by both Solomon and Isaiah (Ecc 8:15
and Isaiah 22:13). This possibly suggests that



these famous OT authors borrowed it from an even earlier source.

The quote is significant because it essentially describes a state of existence without the presence of God in the equation. An atheistic viewpoint to life if you like. We live, we die, we rot (Bertrand Russell) and therefore everything has to be crammed into the space between the living and the dying.

Eating and drinking and merriment are in this context hedonistic activities that are pursued for their own sake because there is no meaning to life other than the fact that it is always terminated by death.

Variations on this theme have been thought up over the centuries in various 'isms' - Nihlism (Nietsche), Existentialism (Camus & Satre) and Utilitarianism (Mill). But they are all essentially the same ethos identified clearly in scripture a very long time ago (there is after all nothing new under the sun!) Are things different for the Christian or do we lead a similarly aimless existence? Matt McLaren and Paul's letter to the Philippians help us to find the answer.
