MAKE THAT CONNECTION - Guy Miller's blog (Leader of Commission)

'Connecting flight' - just the mention of these two words conjure up images of Heather and I running down busy travellators, impatiently queuing behind dismally slow passport control booths with a final sprint to a closed gate and the non-sympathetic airline manager saying, "sorry but you should have arrived five minutes early!" We do the same in London, running for a bus, crowding on the underground



platform, nervously glancing at our watches to get to make that meeting connection.

I listened to the Archbishop of Canterbury New Year's message where he spoke of going for a heroic New Year's Resolution. "Let's resolve to reach out to one person we do not know or from whom we have drifted apart". MAKE THAT CONNECTION!

I think this message is so relevant to us in Commission, turning a page into a new decade and where we gather to a brand new venue for our first Connect Festival.

This is not Westpoint at another venue but a thoughtfully reworked festival with some exciting additions and changes. Our three-fold aims do, however, remain the same: to connect with God, to connect with each other and to Connect with global mission.

I am trusting God for an amazing time and growing numbers of churches coming along for times of joy-filled encounters, kingdom breakthrough moments, and bible teaching that will equip and prepare each person for a season of fruitfulness and flourishing.

I am believing God for a decade of tens of thousands of lives transformed, and hundreds more churches started or restarted, and openings into new nations. Connecting to God, connecting with the person on the edge, the lonely, the lost, the fearful and connecting at Connect Festival.
