ello and welcome to Jubilee Church.

This week Stephen Morris is going to be speaking on what Jesus had to say about poverty.

The subject of poverty is of incredible importance right now and immensely challenging. I've been reading a provoking book called **The myth of the undeserving poor** by Martin Charlesworth & Natalie Williams who lead **Jubilee+**. (There's more information about **Jubilee+** further down.)



They challenge the perception of the easy stereotypes when it comes to the subject of poverty. That we can often find ourselves shaped and influenced by the media into a 'them' and 'us' view of the 'deserving' vs 'undeserving' poor. They ask the question... "When you think of poverty in Britain today, do you picture innocent children going without food or scroungers lounging on the sofa all day watching TV and cheating on benefits claims?"

We are living through an unprecedented crisis. In the UK, since the start of the coronavirus pandemic, nearly two million people have applied for universal credit benefits, that's in addition to the existing 2.6 million people who receive universal credit as of October 2019 - just six months earlier. Unemployment levels are forecast to rise as we read of sweeping redundancies across job sectors, as an example, one Manchester restaurant received 1000 applications for a receptionist job.

"According to the British Government's definition of poverty – households living with an income below 60% of the median household income – and its own statistics released in 2014, almost a quarter of working-age adults in the UK are living in absolute poverty and over 20 million people are in poverty as a whole." **The myth of the underserving poor** 

Those numbers are only likely to worsen over the coming years and it is becoming evidently clearer that as Christians we have a responsibility to act to help those in need.

Stephen Morris is going to unpack this challenging subject further by sharing what instructions Jesus had for us on how to support the poor and perhaps, providing us with practical suggestions of how we can respond now.

#### **DEBTSCAPE SHEPPERTON**

Debtscape started in 2005 as 3 churches working together. In 2012 the single debt centre became two debt centres while the third church created a foodbank. Jubilee Church Shepperton continued with the debt centre and it was renamed Debtscape Shepperton.

We work with people in Spelthorne and parts of Elmbridge. Debtscape Shepperton is affiliated to Community Money Advice who provide training and expertise. There are 3 advisers, John and Diana who have been there from the beginning and Ray who joined us a few years later.

We are currently helping 25 households, who are at various stages of becoming debt free as each household has different needs and solutions. The pandemic has made it difficult for them depending on their employment status and family circumstances. It's also made it harder for us to visit them to help and get documents signed.

Those we have helped are recommending family and friends which is great because debt is one of the hardest things to admit to. In the past couple of years we have also seen or heard how some are joining different churches.

## **Prayer Points:**

- Pray that the team build good relationships with those they're supporting
- Pray for those being supported that they will see God's love for them personally
- Pray for more advisers to join the team

**Jubilee+** exists to equip churches to engage more effectively with their communities and, particularly, to help them increase their capacity to serve the poor.
