Little Nutbrown Hare and Big Nutbrown Hare were involved in a debate with regards to who loved each other the most. It was a competition that Big Nutbrown Hare tended to win because he was taller and could both reach further and jump higher. However, Little Nutbrown Hare remained persistent and just before dropping off to sleep said that he



loved Big Nutbrown Hare "up to the moon". "That is very, very far" agrees Big Nutbrown Hare. "I love you right up to the moon - AND BACK" is the final line of the story.

In this slightly saccharine sweet bedtime classic, love is measured using the very vague yardstick of distance. It all seems very subjective, gushy and emotional and one is left concluding that the whole business is a rather pointless exercise. At the end of the day saying you love someone more than they love you is both unmeasurable and unprovable.

Which is why when God chose to quantify his love for humanity, he did so not in terms of distance but in terms of sacrifice. He gave up a son. And his son gave up a life. Carnie takes up the Limitless Living series this Sunday by looking at God's Limitless Love for us.

In the meantime, I think it would be true to say that whilst Big Nutbrown Hare loved Little Nutbrown Hare to the moon and back, Jesus loved us to the cross and back, which in my mind is a far greater distance.

BAGS OF FOOD

During this week the last of the food boxes we were able to buy with the Winter funding from Surrey County Council were delivered by Morrisons. As you know, these have been well received by families and the funding came at the perfect time for providing lots of help during the peak infection rates in our area. In this short month we have fed 145 people directly from the food and financial donations from our members and local community. Added to this, 36 hygiene packs for the families receiving food boxes delivered directly to them by our volunteer drivers.

DEBTSCAPE

Debtscape Shepperton has continued to meet people's needs throughout the difficult times that we have had over the past year. We are talking to those who have come to us for help, speaking to their creditors and looking for manageable ways out of debt for them.



From September to December there were 12 people asking for help, in 2021 we have had 5 people so far. It is a challenge to explain the process and get paperwork signed, but not insurmountable, especially when there are obstacles to face to face meetings. We also have enquires from outside agencies going on too, sometimes they are the ones doing the face to face meetings and we use them as intermediaries for us. Something to celebrate is that in the past year, despite all the challenges, we have seen **14 people become debt free** as you can imagine they were very grateful for our help.

Please keep praying for us:

- That we would build good relationship with the people we are helping.
- That we would find manageable debt solutions for them.
- That the creditors would be considerate in the current climate.
- That John, Diana and Ray would not be overstretched by the workload.
